



Admissions
Articulation Agreement
Between
The Culinary Institute of America
And
Erie County Technical School

The purpose of this agreement is to enable students who have successfully completed the Erie County Technical School Culinary Arts Program to enter the Culinary Arts or Baking & Pastry Arts degree program at The Culinary Institute of America with advanced standing. Students with advanced standing have satisfied The Culinary Institute of America's foodservice experience admission requirement. A student who maintains a grade of 2.75 on a four point scale or higher in all culinary arts courses and a grade of 2.75 on a four point scale or higher in Math & English courses will be guaranteed upon graduation a position in an entering class at The Culinary Institute of America.

In addition, as part of the articulation agreement students who have successfully completed the Erie County Technical School Culinary Arts Program will also be eligible for up to 4.5 credits towards the total number of credits required for graduation from The Culinary Institute of America.

The Culinary Institute of America will consider credit from the following courses:

- Credit for Culinary Math will be awarded only if Culinary Math by Blocker & Hill was the textbook used for the course.
- Students will need to successfully pass a comprehensive examination for Culinary Math and Nutrition prior to admittance in order for credit to be awarded.
- Documentation (copy) of "ServSafe" certification required.

Terms of Agreement

1. Students must successfully complete the Erie County Technical School Culinary Arts Program.
2. Students must achieve a 2.75 or higher average in the Erie County Technical School Culinary Arts Program

3. Students must submit a letter of recommendation from their Culinary Arts instructor and/or Culinary Arts mentor.
4. Students must submit a copy of their high school transcript.
5. Students must meet all other Culinary Institute of America admissions criteria and standards.
6. The student agrees that if he/she is unable to maintain satisfactory academic progress in which the articulated credit is foundational, the student may be required to take the above mentioned course(s)

It is agreed upon by both The Culinary Institute of America and the Erie County Technical School Culinary Arts Program that any changes, curricular or programmatic, which may impact the terms of this agreement, will be shared immediately by each school.

The college course(s) covered by this articulation agreement are designed to lead to an Associate in Occupational Studies or Bachelor of Professional Studies Degree.

This agreement will be in effect upon the signing of both parties and is valid for three years from the date signed.
