Term II, which runs from October 29 to December 18, has 142 students enrolled in 19 classes. This is a 15% increase in students and a 12% increase in classes from Term II of last year. Our most popular classes are Welding, Industrial Electricity, HVAC, and Medical Terminology.

We added an extra welding class to accommodate those on the waiting list. The additional class meets at the Skill Center on Monday and Wednesday evenings.

Mary Ellen Camp attended the Western Region Adult Coordinator's Meeting at Indiana County Technology Center on November 1. There was discussion on accreditation, sources of adult funding, PDE reporting, and course offerings.

Mary Ellen has a meeting on November 20 with Paul Newlin from the Regional Center for Workforce Excellence to discuss how classes at RCTC might meet the needs for some of the State's "High Demand Occupations".

New Choices/ New Options

We began a new class at the CareerLink site on November 12. We have 14 participants ranging in age from 18 to 61.

New Choices/New Options will offer a program at the Mercyhurst West facility in January.

On November 20 we will be distributing Thanksgiving Food Baskets to a number of our participants. Catholic Charities has provided these baskets to us for many years now and we are very appreciative.
