

High School Activity Report

February, 2010

2ND QUARTER ECTS HONORS:

The second quarter grading period ended January 21, 2011 and with that conclusion, ECTS recognized three groups of outstanding students:

Honor Roll Student – A student who achieved a 95% or better for a lab grade.

74 students obtained the HONOR ROLL status which represents 10% of our population.

Perfect Attendance -- 121 students had PERFECT ATTENDANCE in the 2nd quarter which represents 17% of the ECTS population.

Distinguished Student – An Honor Roll student with Perfect Attendance.

31 ECTS students achieved this recognition which accounts for 4% of the ECTS population.

Pam Lasher did a great job compiling this information for the High School Office, and preparing the certificates to recognize the students' accomplishment.

Snow Sculptures:
