

High School Activity Report

September, 2010

Enrollment:

There are 741 students enrolled in the 19 programs offered at ECTS. The Culinary Arts lab is again the largest program with an enrollment of 82 students; the smallest enrolled program is the Networking Technologies lab with 16 students.

There are four programs operating at a 92% or better capacity for the 2010-11 school year – Art & Design, Cosmetology, Early Childhood Ed, and Health Assistant.

Transition Center Enrollment:

With the beginning of the second year of the Erie County Transition Center, the enrollment of the program as of September 15, 2010 is 25 students.

Second Year of Activities:

ECTS students were involved and treated to eight days of welcoming activities for the opening of the 2010-11 school year. The students were engaged in activities such as Myth Busters Competition, Minute-to-Win-It Competition, Bridge Building Competition, and much more.

The welcoming activities were completed with a “school” picnic that allowed the students the opportunity to play games, mingle among friends and labs, and enjoy a hotdog and pop.

Student Orientation:

Mrs. Patty Palo orchestrated a staff Power Point to present the expectations of ECTS to the student body. Patty’s efforts made a “dull” task fun and enlightening with the integration of the Power Point, pictures of our students, and the music. The sessions also allowed the students the opportunity to address any of their concerns or questions after the orientation.

Fall Fest:

Mr. Curt Oakes and Mrs. Janet Grossman announced that this year’s FALL FEST will occur on Wednesday, October 27, 2010. The Culinary Arts program will again be preparing a feast that will satisfy the hungriest of appetites.

The cost of this dining experience is priced at \$9.00 for adults and \$5.00 for children under the age of eight. The tickets will be available beginning Monday, October 4, 2010.
