TITLE: STUDENT FUND RAISING

ADOPTED: December 19, 1996

	229. STUDENT FUND RAISING
1. Purpose	The Operating Committee acknowledges that the solicitation of funds from students must be limited since compulsory attendance laws make the student a captive donor and since such solicitation may disrupt the program of the school.
2. Definition	For purposes of this policy, student fund raising shall include the solicitation and collection of money by students for any purpose and shall include the collection of money in exchange for tickets, papers, advertising or any other goods or services.
3. Authority	The Operating Committee prohibits the collection of money in school or on school property, or at any school sponsored event by a student for personal benefit. Collection of money by approved school organizations may be permitted by the Director. Collections by students on behalf of school organizations outside the school may be permitted only by the Operating Committee.
4. Delegation of Responsibility	The Director shall establish rules and regulations which shall limit the kind and amount of advertising for solicitation. The principal shall distribute this policy and the rules which implement it to each student organization granted permission to solicit funds.

TITLE: PUBLIC PERFORMANCES BY
STUDENTS

	230. PUBLIC PERFORMANCES BY STUDENTS
1. Purpose	The Operating Committee recognizes the value to students of sharing their talents and skills with the community through student participation and performances in public events.
2. Authority	The Operating Committee endorses such performances when they constitute a learning experience which contributes to the educational program; they do not interfere with other scheduled activities of the school; and the circumstances of the event do not pose a threat to the health, safety and well-being of the students who will be involved. All requests for public performances by student groups require the approval of the Operating Committee.
3. Delegation of Responsibility	The Director shall develop procedures to implement this policy which require that: 1. Parental permission is sought and received before students may participate. 2. No student is compelled to participate in a public performance or penalized in any way for failure to do so. 3. When public performances are scheduled as a regular part of a course of study taken for credit, students shall be informed in advance of their obligation to participate; and they will be excused from participation only in accordance with the rules and procedures governing school attendance. 4. No student, group of students or employees of this Operating Committee may receive compensation for the performance in public of students organized as a school representative.

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	5. All students who are members of the group invited to perform are polled for their willingness to do so and that no request for a performance be granted unless the faculty advisor believes that a sufficient number will participate to represent the school fairly and to acquire a valuable learning experience. 6. The interests of students are protected and guarded against exploitation.

TITLE: COMMUNITY RELATIONS

ADOPTED: December 19, 1996

	910. COMMUNITY RELATIONS 1. Purpose The Operating Committee feels it imperative that communication be maintained between the school and such local institutions, organizations and groups as industry, business, labor, charity and other special interests which make up the structure of the community. 2. Authority The Operating Committee has authority over the pupils in its care, but shares that authority to a limited extent through the cooperative training programs that take certain pupils into the community during part of their educational career. To make those experiences meaningful, the Operating Committee feels cooperation with the community is essential. In reviewing these matters, the administration shall keep in mind that the school shall: 1. Maintain an impartiality among all constituents of the community who promote worthy causes. 2. Not be used to promote private or commercial interests. 3. Not be used for direct sales promotion of goods or services. 4. Not assign pupils to outside tasks which do not benefit the pupil primarily.
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
