

High School Activity Report February 2013

2nd Quarter Recognition: With the end of the semester occurring on January 16th, the Erie County Technical School recognized students in the following three categories:

Perfect Attendance: 144 students had Perfect Attendance in the 2nd quarter which represented 19% of the ECTS population.

Honor Roll Students: 112 students achieved the Honor Roll status; or 14% of the student body.

Distinguished Students: 38 ECTS students achieved this recognition which accounts for 5% of the student population.
