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“Ready To” Series

A representative from PHEAA is scheduled to speak to students on January 27th about paying for college. Scholarship information and other resources to help with the cost of post-secondary education are provided to students on an on-going basis.

Lessons in Job Search skills, Resume Writing, and Job Applications from the “Ready to Work” series are being conducted in the labs with students. Representatives from the trades are being contacted to participate in the annual Apprenticeship Discussion Panel, scheduled for March 19, 2015. Representatives from the Military are also being contacted to participate in an upcoming Military Panel presentation scheduled for February 26, 2015.
