

High School Activity Report

September 2014

Enrollment

Because of issues with the new student management system, gaining accurate count of enrollment has been a challenge. To the best of the facts that are available, there are 781 students enrolled at the Erie County Technical School. This is a decrease of 12 students from the 2013-14 school year at this time.

Transition Center Enrollment

The Erie County Transition Center has an enrollment of 25 students as of September 16, 2014. This enrollment is a decrease from the initial enrollment from the 2013-14 school year by one student. Harbor Creek and Iroquois have the largest population with 4 students each enrolled; several districts have enrolled two or less student at this time – General McLane, Union City and North East.

First 8 Days of Activities

ECTS students were involved in a variety of activities during the initial 8 days of school. The activities were built around the Minute-To-Win-It theme. Again, these activities were designed to encourage team work and school unity. A special morning activity was to have students make the ECTS logo come to life for the third year.
