Cyber Charter School Enrollments

Tim Sennett attended the PAC meeting to assist in the discussion concerning the cyber charter school request for sending their students to ECTS. After discussion of the implications and effects, the majority decision from the superintendents in attendance was that we are not interested in pursuing an agreement for participation.

Adult Diploma Program

Joan Stitzinger held a lengthy discussion with the superintendents pertaining to the barriers that they have encountered with the Erie City Mission and the Porreco locations. Joan compared the success of the Warren and Corry locations and discussion evolved about how we may be able to facilitate more participation in specific school districts. We will explore piloting specific sites and reevaluate after establishing the additional sites. Discussion also highlighted the increased requirements for GED assessment proficiency versus a High School Equivalency exam.

2016-2017 Budget

Dr. Jackson reviewed budget projections with the superintendents for the 2016-17 ECTS budget. An approximate increase of 3.14% increase was discussed. Superintendents in attendance supported the increase.
