Curriculum Development

At the end-of-the year luncheon held June 3rd, we recognized programs that met or exceeded the state expectations for students' NOCTI scores. Programs that achieved the goal of 75% or higher with Advanced *and* Competent scores received a **Commended Program** certificate:

- Auto Body Repair
- Computer Networking
- Electronics
- Facility Maintenance
- Graphic Communications
- Tourism & Hospitality Management

Programs that achieved the goal of 75% or higher with their Advanced scores were given a **Distinguished Program** certificate:

- Automotive Technology
- Computer Programming
- Construction Trades
- Culinary Arts
- Diversified Occupations
- Early Childhood Education
- Electrical Engineering
- Health Assistant

We also recognized four programs for maintaining national accreditation status. These programs have proven that they meet national skill standards, have undergone a rigorous self-study with industry input and have passed an on-site evaluation completed by a representative of the national organization. A plaque will be hung outside the classroom doors of:

- Automotive Technology, NATEF Accredited
- Culinary Arts, ACFEF Accredited
- Early Childhood Education, NAEYC Accredited
- Graphic Communications, PrintED Accredited

And, 17 instructors participated in our summer curriculum development work held from June 6-17th. Projects included updating of Duty/Task Lists, Sequence Charts and Syllabi.

Special Education

End of the Year Report Cards - Jan and Pat sent out the fourth quarter grades, for all students with Individualized Education Plans (IEPs) and Section 504 Plans, to our home schools' special education staff and guidance counselors. The fourth quarter percent of success for our student with disabilities is 94% and 97% success rate for the complete school year.

Instructional Aide Evaluations- Pat completed all ten of the instructional aide's end of the year evaluations. All of the instructional aides have shown a variety of professional growth in this school year.

Enrollment Update- Currently of the 302 newly admitted ECTS students, 84 students have been identified as students with some type of disability. Students with disabilities make up 28% of our new student population.
