Career Planning Coordinator Board Report
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Career Objectives

The Career Planning Coordinator (CPC) has presented the annual Educational and Occupational Objectives forms to students across all labs. The CPC is working to ensure that all students properly complete these forms as part of their educational plan.

WIN

The CPC has been working with personnel at WIN to get our entire student body enrolled into the WIN Career Readiness System. Currently, 76 ECTS students are active in the WIN system. The goal is to have students achieve level 5 and earn their Gold certificate prior to their graduation. Level 2 and 3 students in Precision Machining are working to complete their Career Readiness assessments in Locating Information, Reading for Information and Applied Math to Level 5 (Gold Certificate) or higher by the end of the first quarter. The CPC plans to present WIN to the faculty in October.

NOCTI

The CPC has started planning for NOCTI online pre-testing in October. Finalization of students taking the NOCTI has been completed and on-line tests are being ordered.

Advanced Training Day

The CPC has also been busy planning for Advanced Training Day, scheduled for Oct 28, 2015. Over 50 colleges, trade organizations, employers and military representatives have been invited to participate in this event; to date 30 have committed to attend. ECTS's Advanced Training Day showcases some of the post-secondary opportunities that exist for our students following their high school graduation.
