

High School Activity Report

September 2015

Enrollment:

There are 778 students enrolled at the Erie County Technical School. This is a decrease of 3 students from the 2014-15 school year at this time.

Transition Center Enrollment:

The Erie County Transition Center has an enrollment of 31 students as of September 16, 2015. This enrollment is an increase from the initial enrollment from the 2014-15 school year by six students. Union City has the largest population with 7 students enrolled.

First 8 Days of Activities:

The Erie County Technical School students were involved in a variety of lab and school building activities during the initial 8 days of school. The activities were built around the Minute-To-Win-It theme. Again, these activities were designed to encourage team work and school unity. 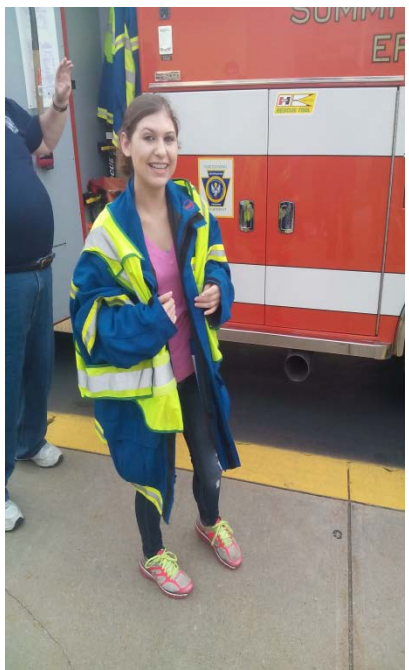
“Reasons” for choosing this activity:

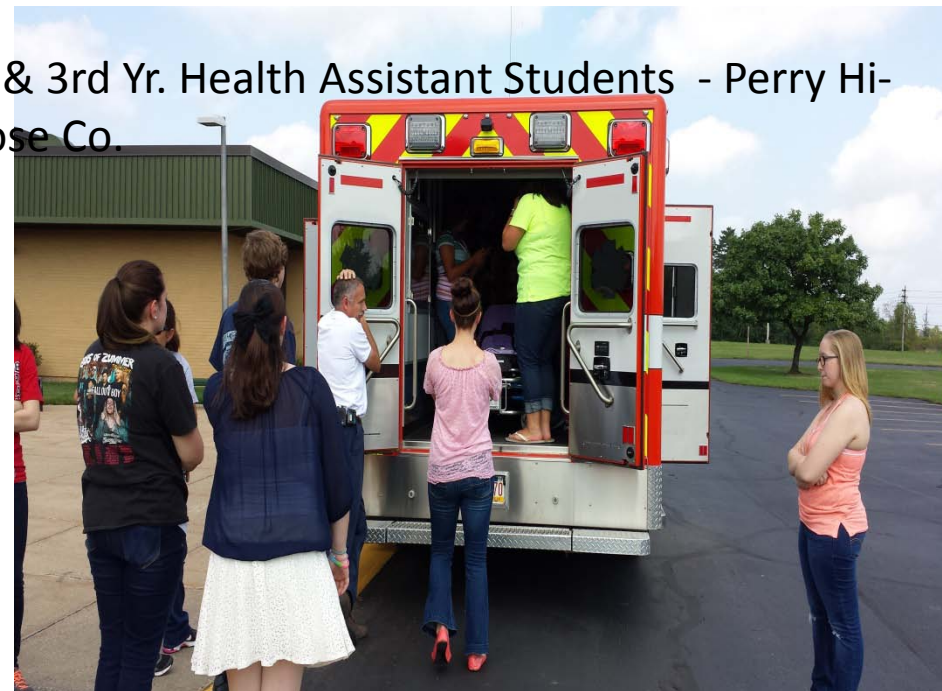
