

High School Activity Report

September 2017

Enrollment:

There are 759 students enrolled at the Erie County Technical School. This is a decrease of 38 students from the 2016-17 school year at this time.

Transition Center Enrollment:

The Erie County Transition Center has an enrollment of 40 students as of September 18, 2017. This enrollment is an increase from the initial enrollment from the 2016-17 school year by eight students. Harbor Creek has the largest population with 8 students enrolled, with North East close behind with 7 students enrolled.

First 8 Days of Activities:

The Erie County Technical School students were involved in a variety of lab and school building activities during the initial 8 days of school. The activities were built around the Minute-To-Win-It theme. Again, these activities were designed to encourage team work and school unity. A special afternoon activity was to have students make the ECTS logo come to life for the sixth year.
