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## *High School Activity Report*

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### **June 2022**

**Current Enrollment:** Concluding the 2021-2022 school year, the Erie County Technical School was operating at 72.9% capacity with 665 students. This is an increase of 36 students from the 2020-2021 school year at this time.

The concluding enrollment for the Transition Center was 34 students. This was an increase of 11 students from the 2020-2021 school year at this time.

**Senior Awards Ceremony:** The Senior Awards Ceremony was held on Wednesday, June 1, 2022 at Fort LeBoeuf High School. The graduating class gathered in three groups to support continued social distancing.
