Career Planning

- **Struggles to Strengths.** We have completed two full sessions of the SEL/emotional support program. Planning is underway for the month of May and next year.
- **Occupational Objective Forms.** Due to technical difficulties we were unable to complete the process of getting all the signatures for the PA State form on line. We quickly implemented the paper process we have used in previous years and are collecting signed forms from students.
