Purpose

The Joint Operating Committee operates the Erie County Technical School for the benefit of students who are residents in one of the participating school districts.[\[1\]](#)[\[2\]](#)

Authority

The Joint Operating Committee may admit nonresident students from outside the attendance areas of participating school districts if space warrants such admission and an appropriate program can be provided.[\[3\]](#)[\[4\]](#)[\[5\]](#)

Nonresident students may be admitted upon payment of annually established tuition rates.[\[3\]](#)[\[4\]](#)[\[5\]](#)

Students Experiencing Educational Instability

The Joint Operating Committee directs the center (school) to immediately admit students experiencing homelessness and other forms of educational instability, even if the required documents are unavailable, in accordance with Joint Operating Committee policy, law and regulation.[\[6\]](#)[\[7\]](#)

Children of Active Duty Military Families

Children of active duty military families shall be eligible for admittance to the center (school) in accordance with the Interstate Compact on Educational Opportunity for Military Children and Joint Operating Committee policy.[\[8\]](#)

Delegation of Responsibility

The Administrative Director or designee shall develop administrative regulations for the enrollment of nonresident students.
