Curriculum Development

Student Certifications and Task Grid Updates – Instructors are entering the student certifications earned during the current school year into CTE-360. Current certifications offered are compared to the PDE Industry-Recognized Credentials for CTE programs. In addition, task grids for seniors will be completed using the CTE-360 platform.

Curriculum –Summer curriculum work will focus on working with new instructors in updating sequence charts and preparing curriculum documents. Other instructors will be revising curriculum documents and developing unit plans in CTE-360.

NOCTI/NIMS - Senior NOCTI/NIMS testing is complete for our 280 senior concentrators. Results have been downloaded and 157 students scored “Advanced” (56%), 79 students scored “Competent” (28%), and 40 students scored “Basic” (14%) and 4 students were “Incomplete (1%).

Articulation – We have a new agreement with Mercyhurst University offering credits to our graduates in Art & Design For Business, Graphic Media & Design, Early Childhood Education, Computer Programming, Computer Networking, and Drafting & Design For Engineering.

In addition, we have a new agreement with the Erie County Community College offering 9 elective credits for their Associate of Applied Business in Management and Entrepreneurial Thinking Degree Program. This agreement covers 15 of our programs. We also have an agreement for 3 credits in this major for our Diversified Occupations students.

We have renewed our agreement with Penn College of Technology for our Diversified Occupations program. There is a motion for approval on the agenda for these agreements.

Special Education

Roster Verification- We will provide sending school counselors and case managers comprehensive lists of next year’s students and will ask them to verify that we have properly identified all of the students with disabilities who will be attending ECTS in the fall. Sandy and Lesa continue to communicate with sending schools and attend meetings for accepted students with IEP/504 plans.

Instructional Aides –End-of-year evaluations for the Instructional Aides will be completed soon. Their support of our students and staff is instrumental to the success of the Erie County Technical School and we are grateful for the services they provide.
